Learning more about mental health

Two FT member events will be held in Wiltshire in the spring – in Green Lane Hospital, Devizes on 1 March and in Chippenham on 18 May.

These follow the success of the members' event held at Bristol's Callington Road Hospital at the end of last year.

Those attending were encouraged to give feedback so that future member events would be of maximum interest. Some 58 per cent said the November event had fully met their expectations. Most people said they had learned from the event and no one said their expectations had not been met. The art and music workshops were praised, as were the stories told by service users and carers about their experiences.

Plans are also being made for events to be held in Weston super Mare, Swindon, Bath and Bristol and dates will be published soon.

Drug trials

A new drug called Gantenerumab that could slow down Alzheimer's Disease in its early stages is being tested in AWP's Kingshill Research Centre in Swindon. The drug is intended for patients with Mild Cognitive Impairment who do not yet have a diagnosis of Alzheimer's but who may go on to develop the disease. Kingshill has been carrying out clinical trials for 20 years and has participated in the studies for all the current licensed drugs for Alzheimer's. Support for veterans

The South West Veterans Mental Health Service, a new partnership between AWP and Combat Stress, has been launched. The aim of this innovative service is to deliver improved care and support to former service personnel who suffer mental health problems as a result of their military experiences. With the South West hosting approximately 42,000 serving service personnel and a high number of veterans, support of this kind is clearly needed. One of the key tools of the new service is the website www.swveterans.org.uk which offers advice, guidance, links, comments from other veterans and a helpline number allowing veterans or their families to self-refer to support services.
